4. Do you agree that Thorp Arch should aim to minimize its carbon footprint?

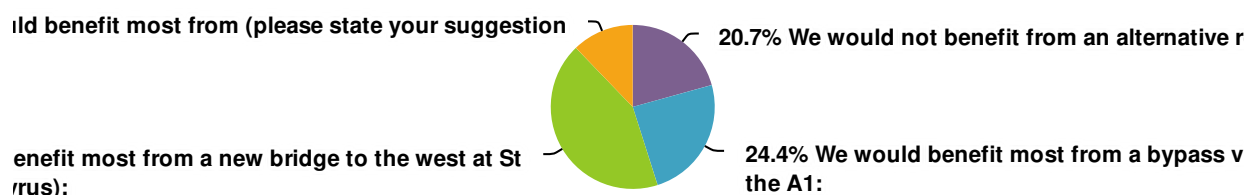

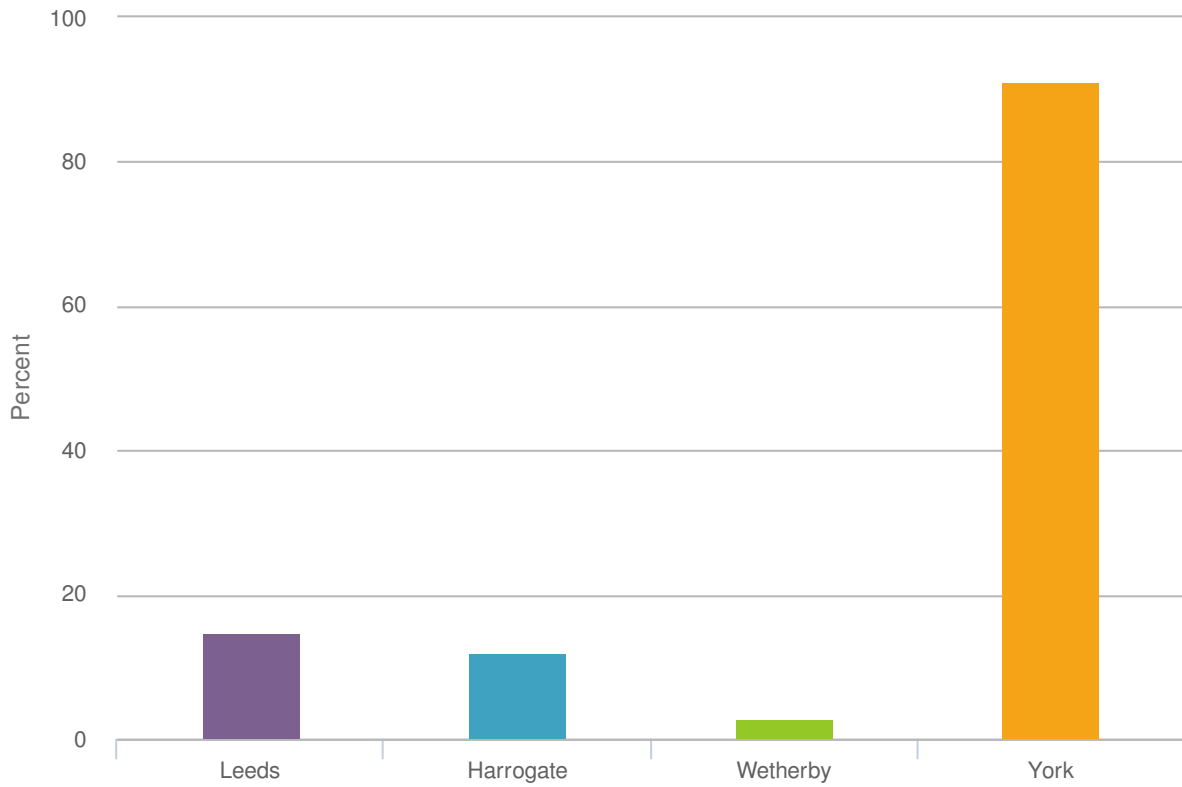

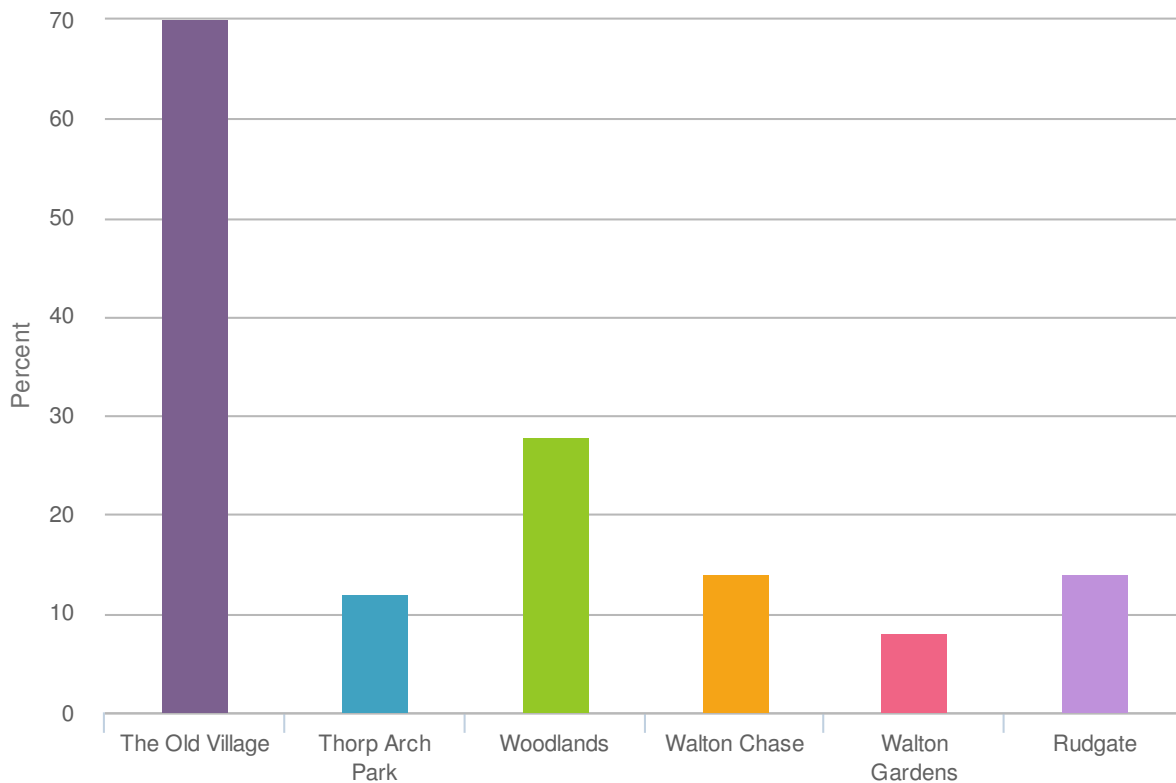

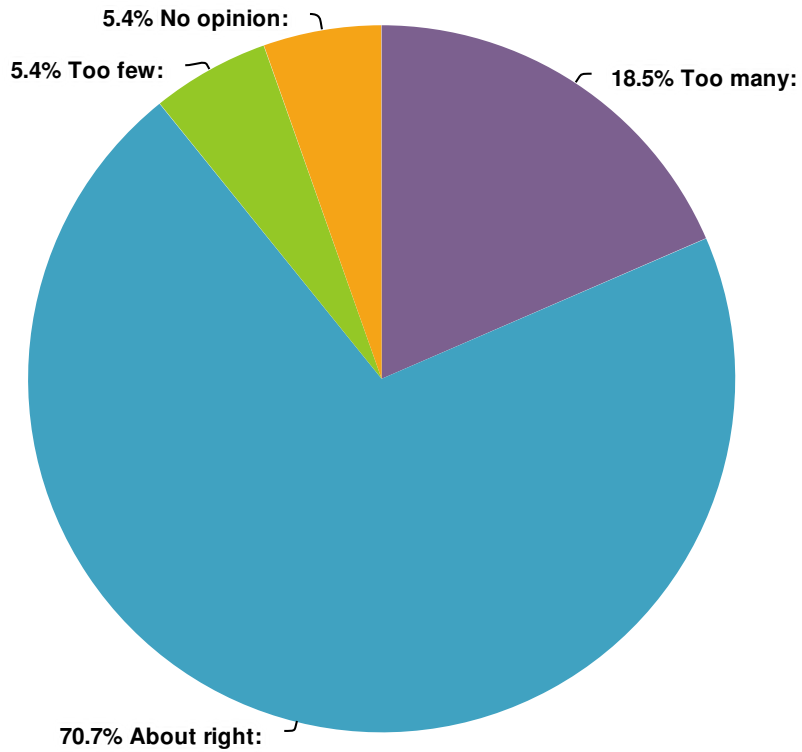

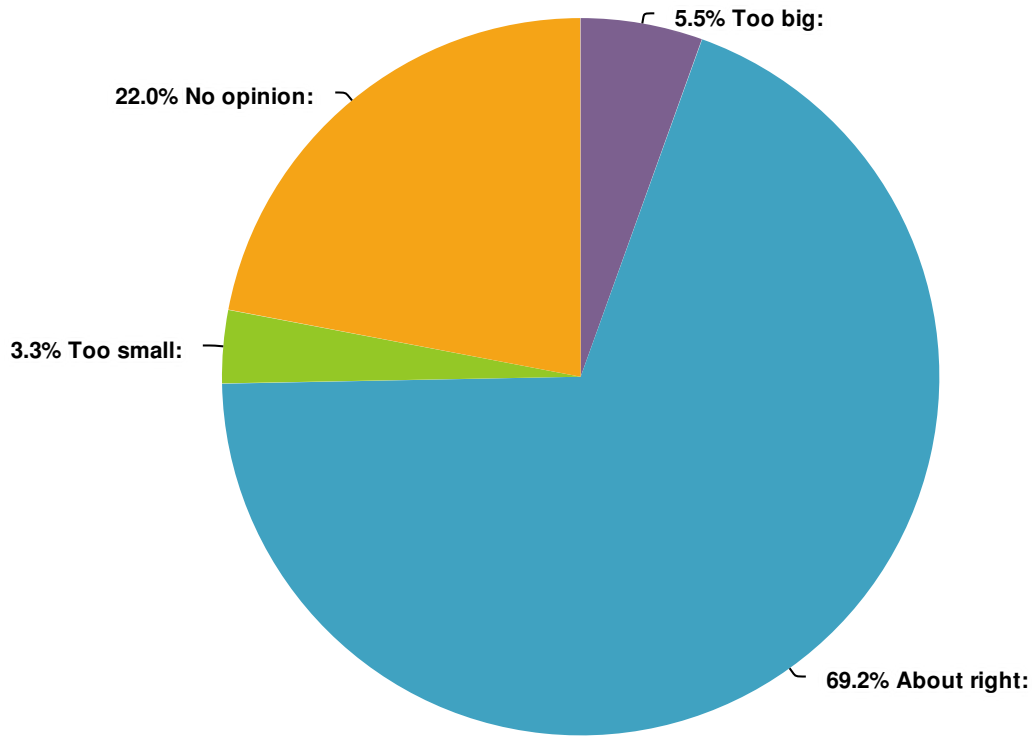

10. What do you think about the number of houses that have been built in Thorp Arch over the past 10 years?



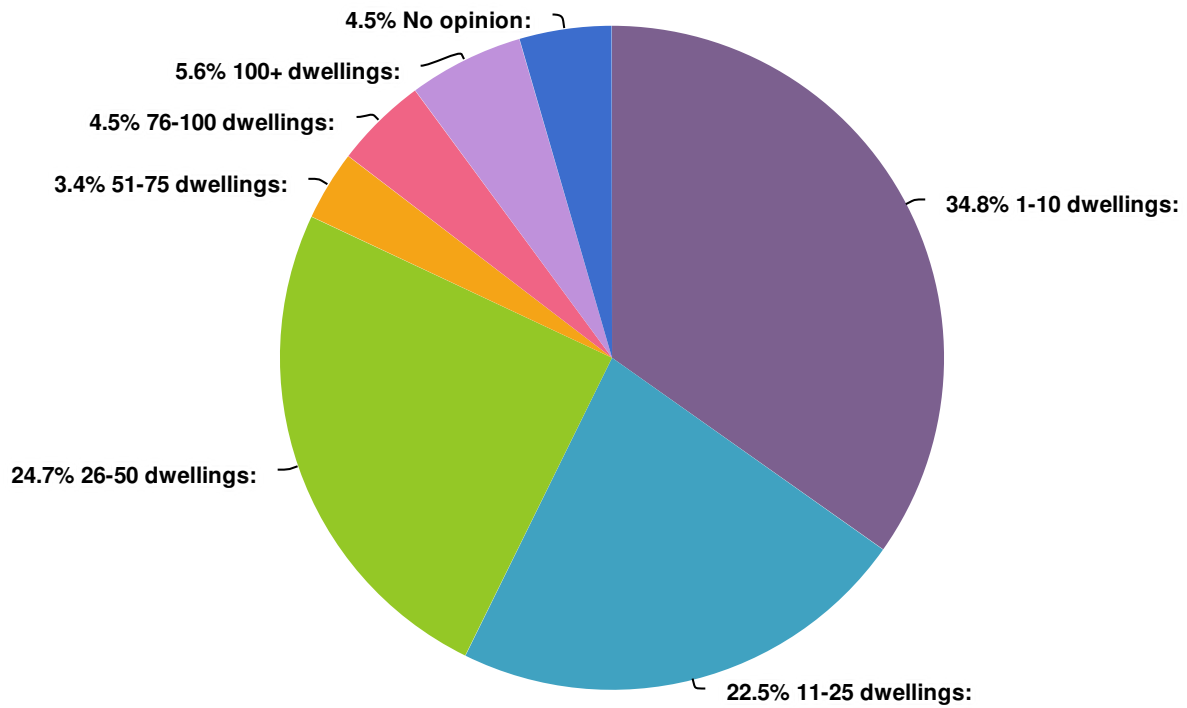

11. What do you think about the type of houses that have been built in Thorp Arch over the past 10 years?



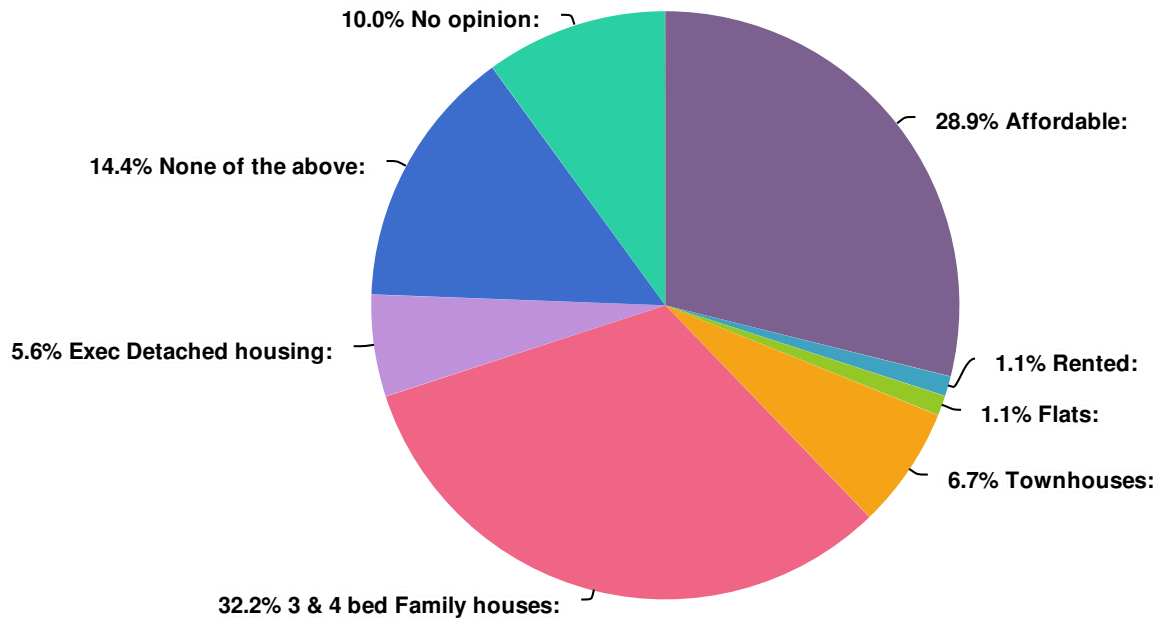

12. How many new dwellings should be built in Thorp Arch over the next 15 years?



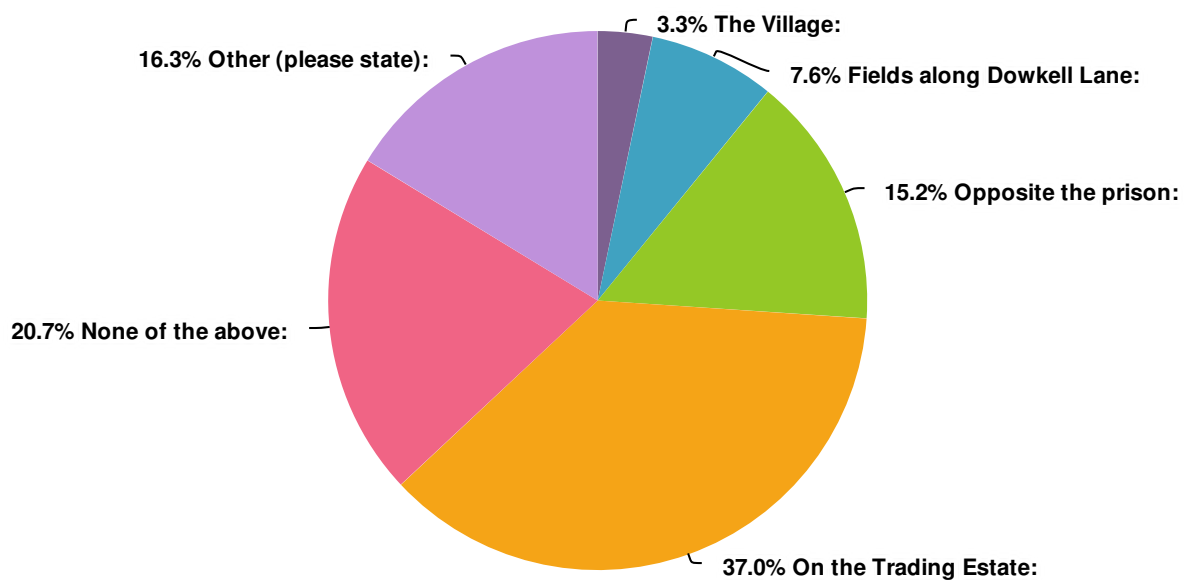

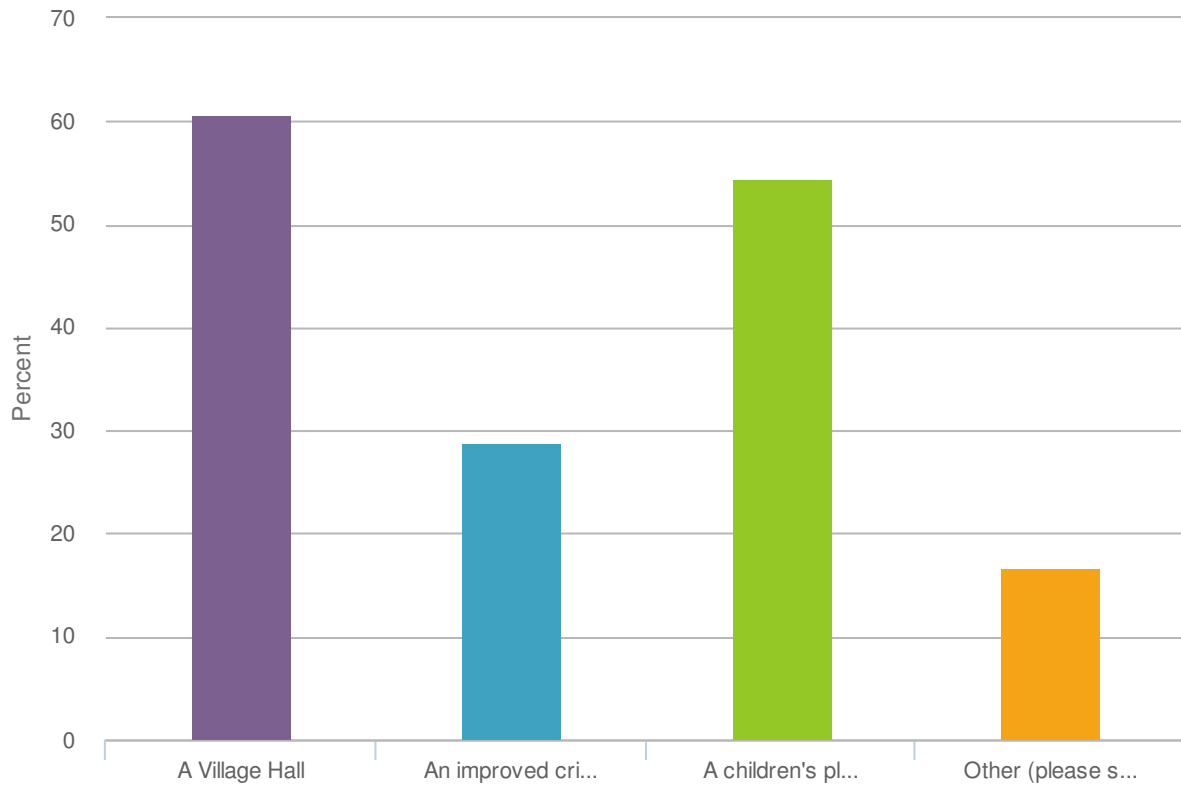

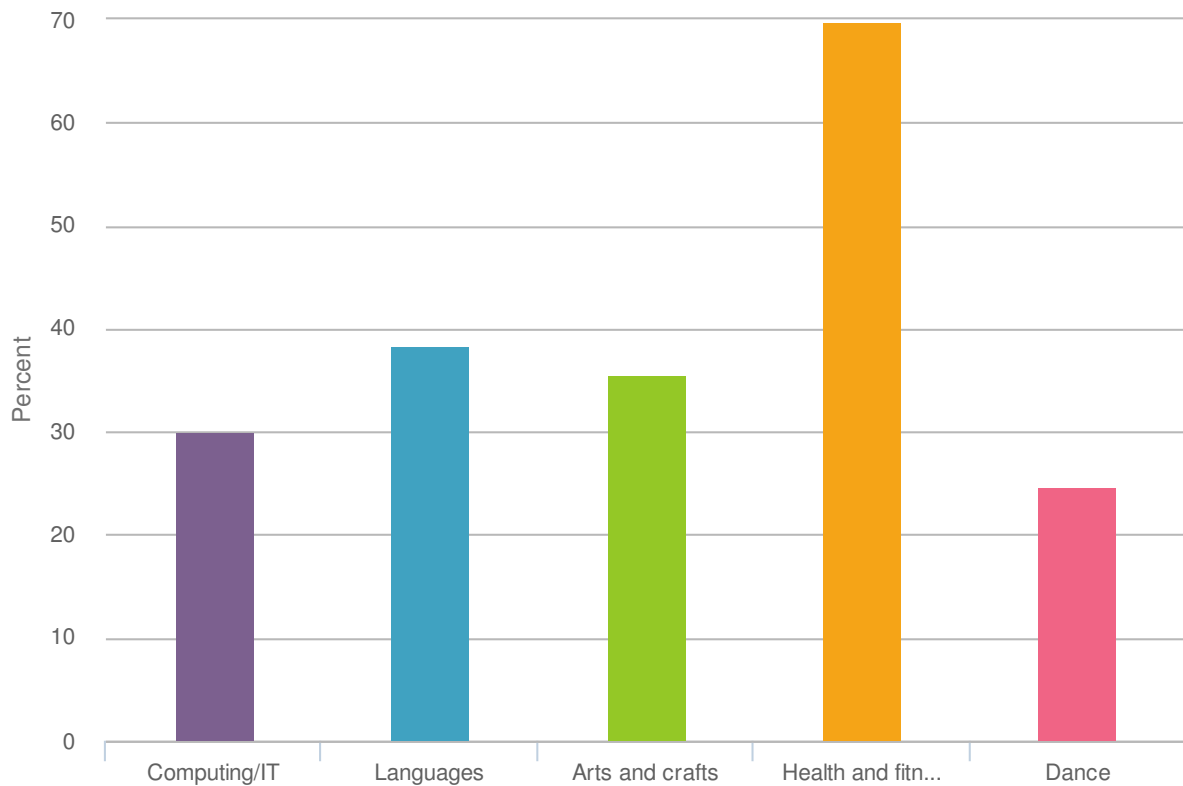

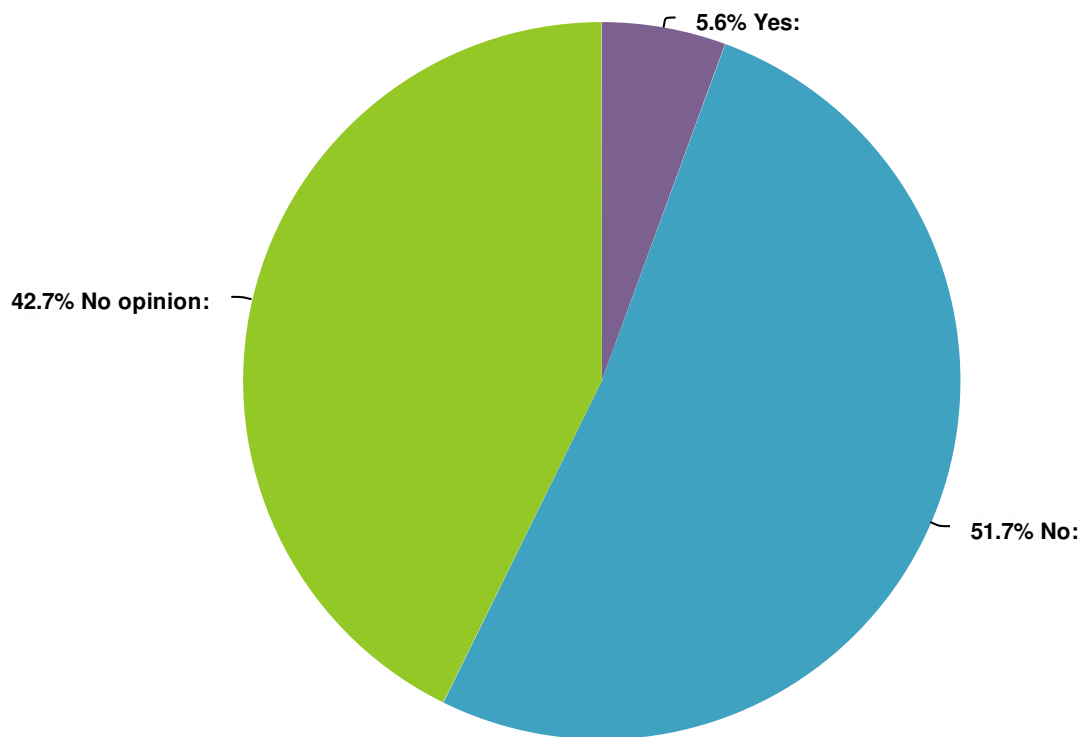

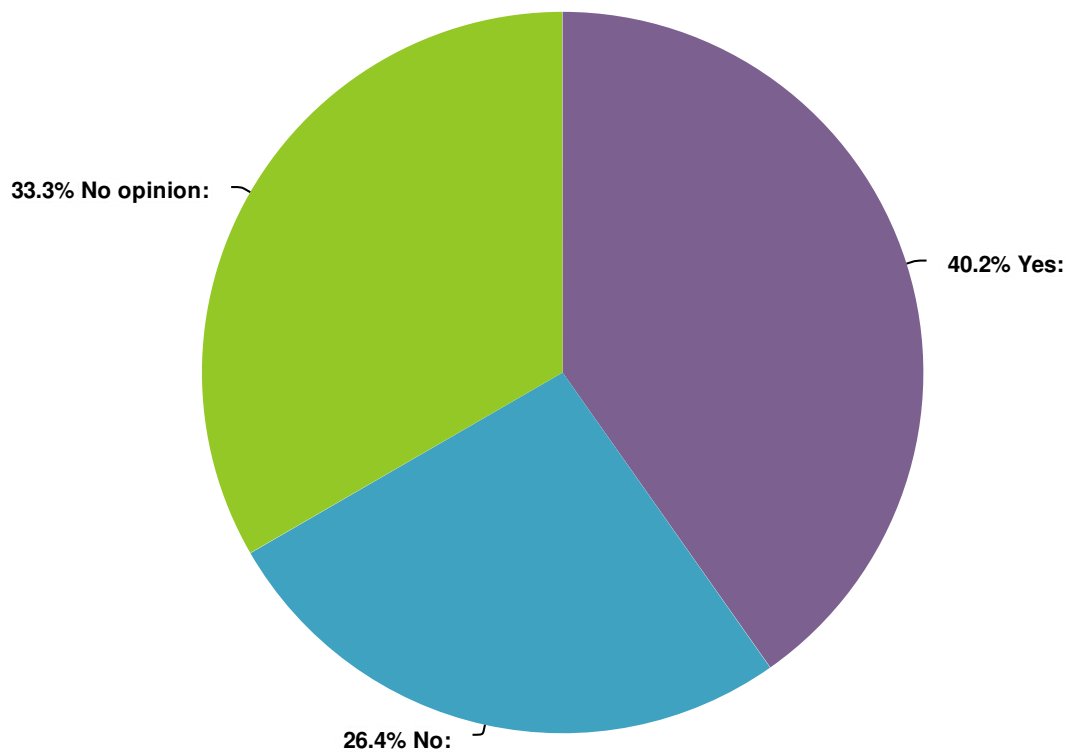

19. Are there sufficient social provision/clubs made available for teenagers?



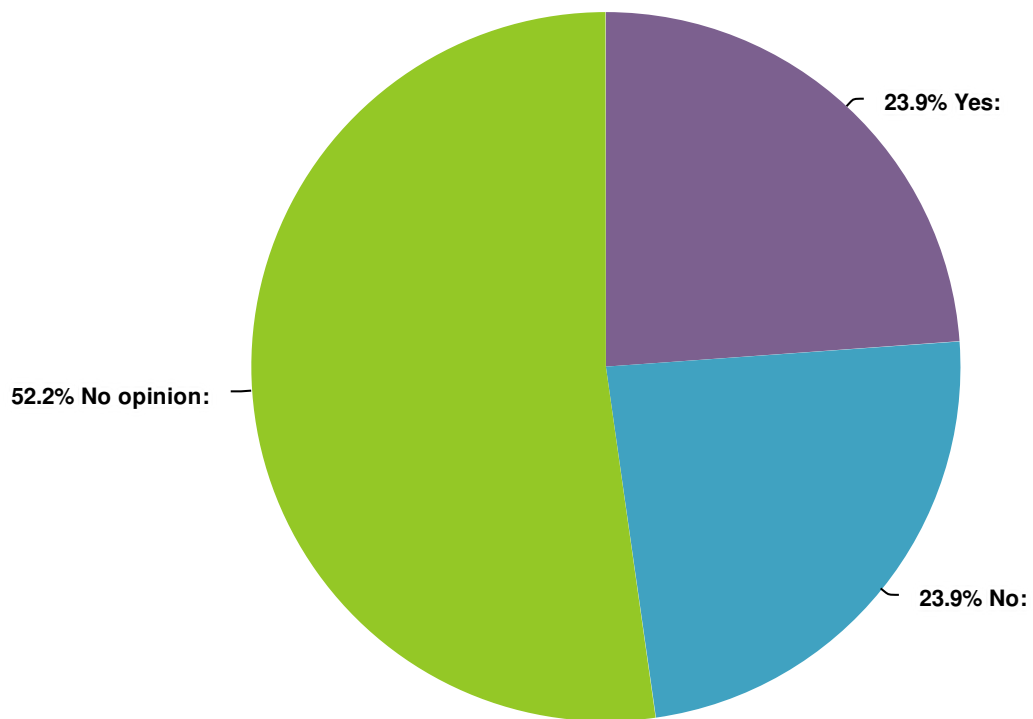

20. Are there sufficient social provision/clubs made available for work age adults?



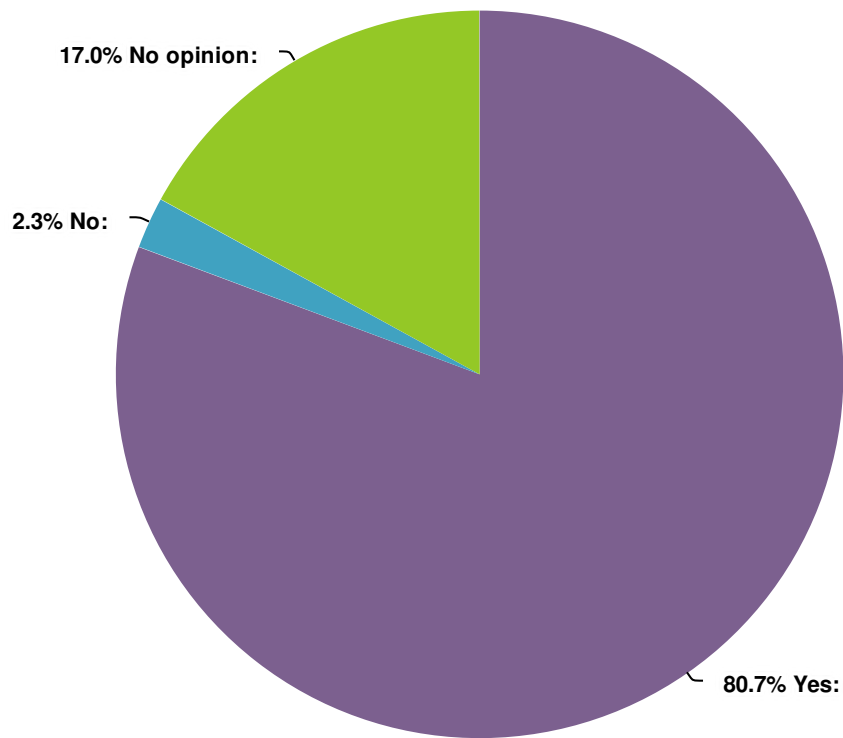

21. Are there sufficient social provision/clubs made available for retired adults?



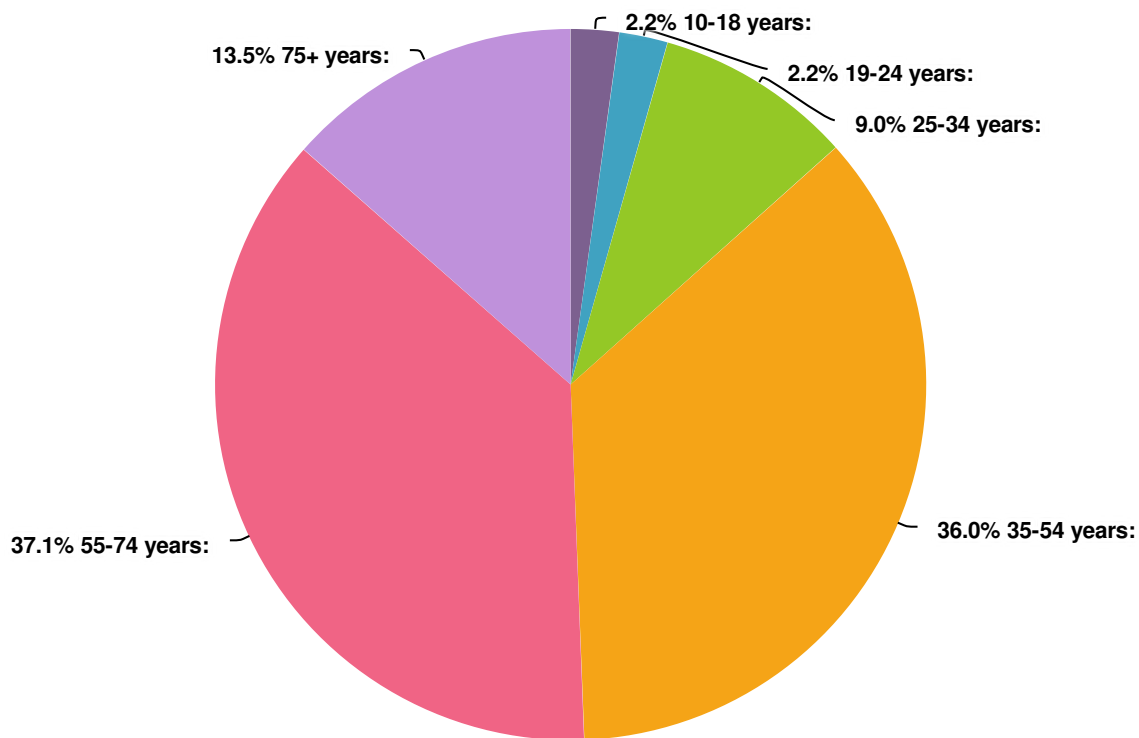

22. Should Thorp Arch's broadband speed be increased?



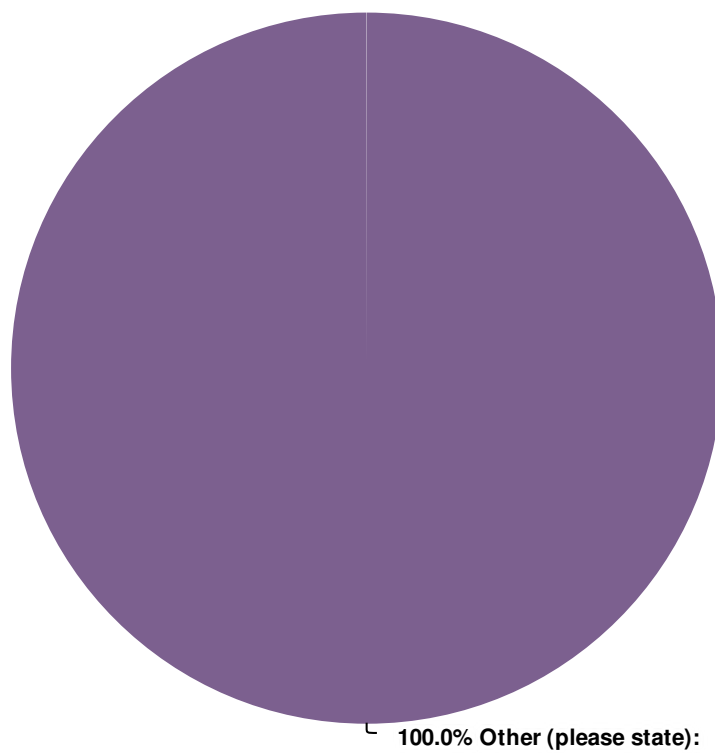

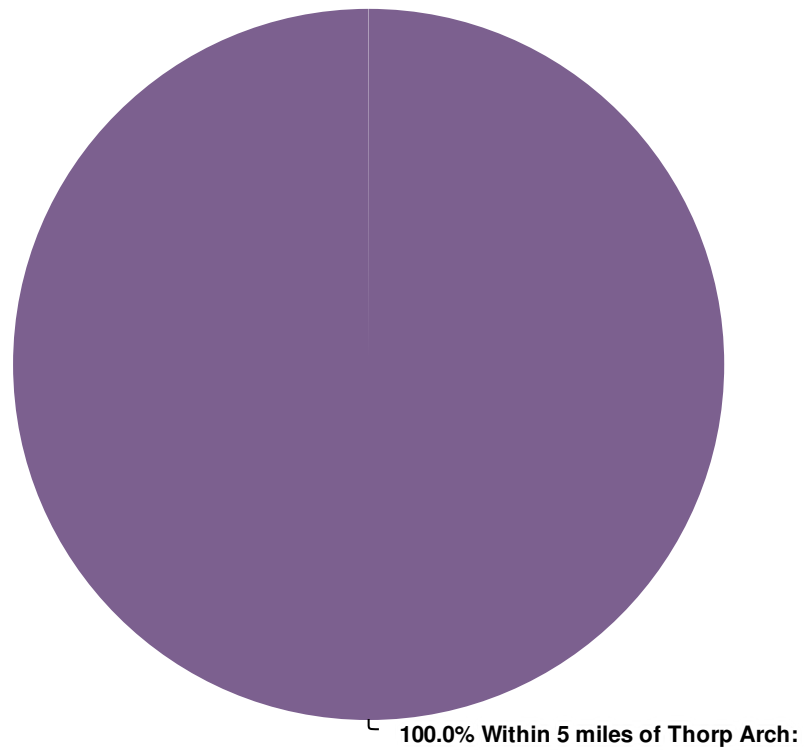
26. What will be the likely reason for you no longer living in Thorp Arch?

27. Where should new businesses and job creation be sited to benefit young people the most?



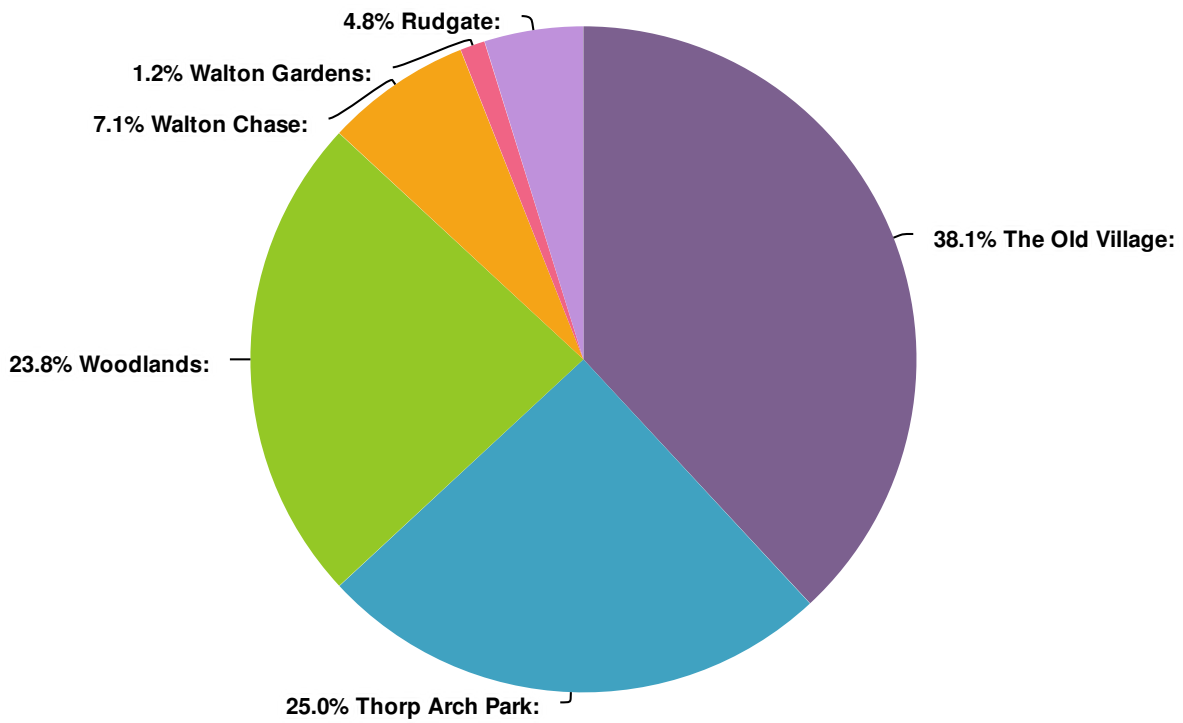

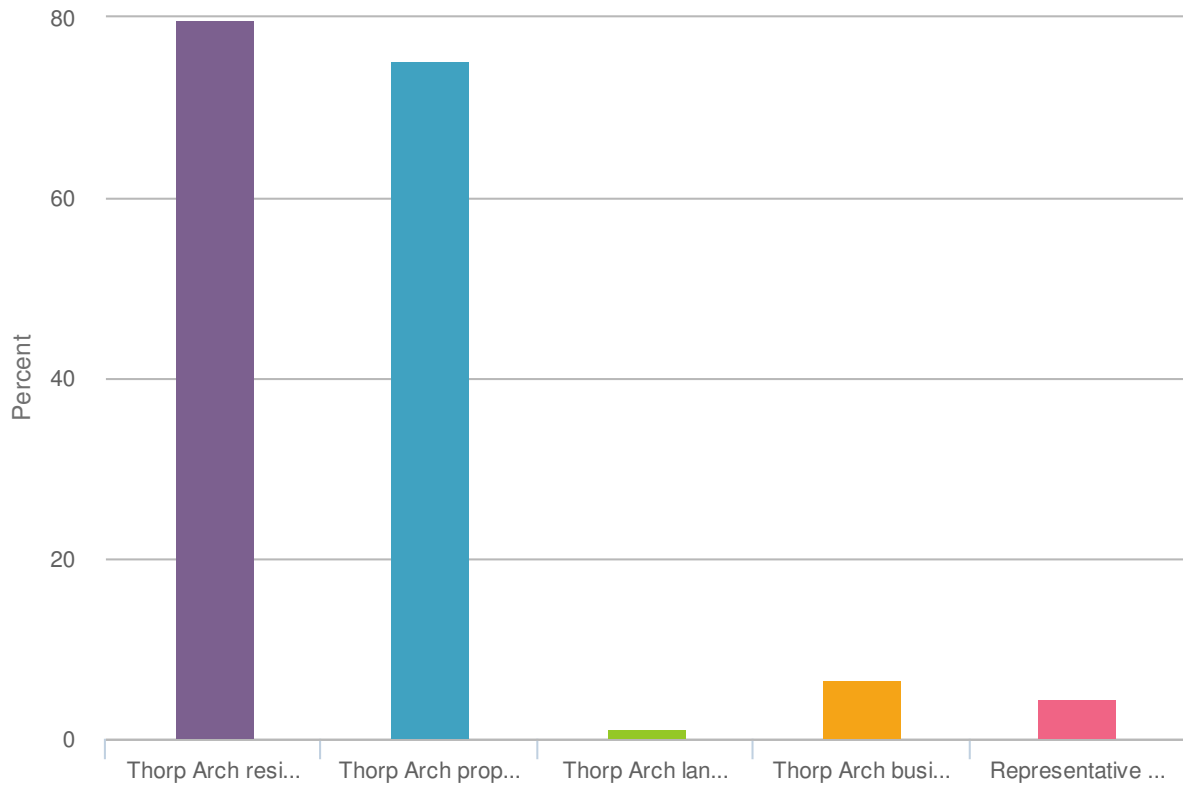

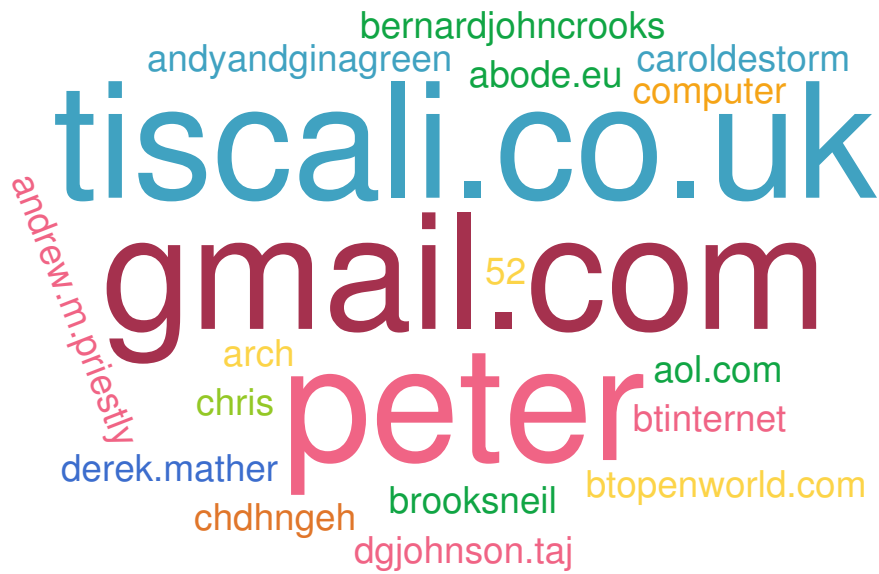

1	2 other types of dwellings required, town houses and more 3/4 beds, Calming measures on the Bridge
1	20 mph from the bridge through the village
1	A community needs all kinds of people, young, old and not so well off. TA particularly needs the young.
1	Access to the A1 & Leeds must be a major factor in any future development on the village side of the river. The bridge and roads leading to it on both sides of the river are inadequate at commuting times, but alternative routes via the Walton Road the new A1 bypass already exist, but are not used and will not be used without further restrictions and enforcement. A new bridge will probably be vetoed on cost grounds and there is no road infrastructure at present. Also a bridge at the placed indicated will mainly divert traffic heading for the Tadcaster direction therefore depending on the route of feeder roads, either further spoil parts of Thorp Arch or it may attract more traffic through Boston Spa and it will adversely affect the environment of those living along and adjacent to the Boston Spa to Tadcaster Road.
1	Also more 3/4 bed houses needed Q 12
1	Avoid over development and preserve existing green area's
1	Building behind woodlands would increase volume and speed of traffic through the development , causing increased risk to the high number of children who live there . I feel building should be avoieded close to residential areas as there are large areas of open space available.
1	Ensure proper provision of off stree parking. Route across the bridge may need limiting depending on size/number of new dwellings.
1	Hope it can be isolated from any Trading Estate developments
1	I am all for development, the more the merrier

1	I don't think Thorp Arch "needs" new housing but if it going to happen then I don't think townhouses are in keeping with the area.
1	I strongly discourage an further development around or near reidential areas when there are is so much land available away from current residential developments
1	I think we need to retain the village feel of Thorp Arch and the plans to add 1000's of house to the trading estate is highly concerning. The traffic around the area is already a problem and this will only increase if it goes ahead.
1	Make every effort to include all comments from all residents, ages and areas of Thorp Arch before developing a neighbourhood plan. Not all areas of Thorp Arch are represented on the steering group and I hope this does not affect decision-making adversely.
1	NO MORE development at all. Q & Q8 should read Wood Lane
1	No residential development of the village necessary
1	Not sure whether the birdge is counted as being in Thorp Arch but I think this is both a danger spot and needs traffic calming - not in terms of humps but chicanes like in Rufforth
1	Part of TAs charm is that it is just a village. To build too many houses would spoil it.
1	Q12 also Exec Homes
1	Q3 is a leading question & should be rephrased for responses to be valid
1	Q4 New lighting- too many lamps. Q7 & 8 the Bridge. Q12 Sheltered housing for the elderlyl have lived in TA for over 45 years so please do not spoil it with over development
1	Q7 Danger spot end of Church Causeway by War Memorial
1	Ref Q5 If Trading Estate houses are built, there MUST be a condition that a new bridge providing an exit south that goes over the river. Ref Q7 & Q8 Road calming around area of church - VERY dangerous at present.
1	Road danger spots on Walton Road. Properties built too expensive
1	Shop would be good but probably not viable. (what about a pub shop?) Why isn't the road to the tennis court not made up? Lethal in icy winter conditions. It is part of a public right of way. We need a bowling green, Play ground and football field.

1	The Village atmosphere must be protected, especially in the light of the plans for TATE
1	The heritage of the Village must be preserved. Any major development would destroy it. Local roads and amenities could not cope.
1	The historic character of the village should be protected
1	Too many extensions increasing density and removing off street parking in old village
1	Traffic through the village is particularly high. Many lorries come through even though they should not come over the bridge. Any future development needs an alternative route not through the village,
1	We Need traffic calming measures near Woodlands and a pedestrian crossing before a child or elderly person is injured or worse. Traffic coming along the main road outside the prison frequently ignores the speed limit when it reduces to 30 mph. Something needs doing with this road to reduce the noise i.e. laying of a more sympathetic surface. At moment is half concrete. Could do with installation of live speed camera. Also need Leeds council to manage hedgerows all the way along main road outside prison.
1	We are strongl against developments in TA VILLAGE and feel that the Prison area and Trading Estate would be better sites. Not in the Old Village and surrounding countryside.
1	Your survey didn't include the area where I live, which is further along church causeway
1	danger spot, the bridge. Need retirement bungalows
